Who Was Melchizedek?



The great king Melchizedek appears in the bible just a few times. We do not know very much about him, and scholars have disagreed on some things about this mysterious king. But Jesus is compared to Melchizedek, so we know he is important!

In this bible study we will look at the places Melchizedek shows up in the bible and try to understand a little more about him. Get your bible and pencil ready... here we go!

1. Find **Hebrews 6:19-7:3** in your bible. Read the passage.

2. Now let's back up. Turn to Genesis 14.

Here is a little background: Abram (who would later be called Abraham) and his family had left Ur and were living in Bethel. There were so many people and animals with him that the land could not support everyone. So they split up - Abram moved to Hebron, and his nephew Lot moved to Sodom. All the people and animals that were with each of these men went with them. The story you are about to read happened after the big split.

a.	Sacrifice was necessary to cleanse people of their sins. Before Jesus came, the people
	had to bring a sacrificial offering to priests in order to be forgiven of their sins. Read
	1 John 2:2 and Hebrews 7:27. Do we still have to make sacrificial offerings? Why or

b. Mosaic Law (the commands in Old Testament) very clearly stated that priests must be Levites. God wanted a forever priest on the throne. **Read Hebrews 7:14-19 and Hebrews 7:28**. What do these verses tell you about the similarities between Jesus and Melchizedek?
