The Passage: Delving into Details

- What words draw my attention? Which seem most important?
- Are there repeated words or phrases?
- Are there references to other Scriptures?
- What would I consider the key verse of this passage? Why?
- How do these ideas relate to themes or verses elsewhere in the Bible?

The Present: Responding in Praise and Prayer

- Is God leading me to memorize or meditate on any verses?
- What truths are revealed in this passage? Does it reveal the character of God or show me about myself or my community?
- Is God leading me to do anything differently?
- How am I led to pray?
- Respond in worship. Write, speak, read aloud, or sing.

Finding a Bible Study Spot

Questions to Ask:

What is my current season?

How much time do I have to study?

Do I need to do my studying "non-traditionally?" (Like while I get ready for work, using a podcast while I'm driving, etc.)

Do I need a "portable office?" If so, when will I set it up?

Do I focus best when things are quiet? Do I need worship music? Background noise?

Do I need a table top surface?

Do I need a comfy-cozy spot?

What supplies will I be using? Where will I put them? Store them?

Do I need access to a computer? Reference books?

Do I need to create a separate prayer or personal quiet time spot, away from my Bible study work-zone?

Do I need to think outside the box? What can I do differently?

What are my challenges? Do I need to add or eliminate something?

Three Ways to Engage

Scribble:

Grab a notebook and a pen or pencil. As you read through your chosen passage of Scripture, write down anything and everything that occurs to you. Impressions, thoughts, questions, musings, prayers, words or phrases that strike you – anything! Write it out like a bullet point list or take the time to journal.

Doodle:

As you take notes or go back over notes you've taken, add swirls and shapes and colors to the page. Trace important words to make them bold. Try your hand at balloon letters or calligraphy. If an image strikes you, make a little sketch of what you think it might look like. The more you do it, the more comfortable you will be with your doodles.

Read Out Loud:

Find a quiet (ish) space where you won't feel self-conscious. Choose your passage of Scripture and read it out loud. Don't worry about volume or pronunciation, just speak the words.
